

# National Security College Executive Level 1 Development Program

## 19 – 30 June 2017

This program will enhance understanding of the national security community and the range of strategic issues it faces. It will facilitate important professional collaborative networks.

This highly interactive and practical program analyses recent case studies and explores the themes of national security challenges, collaborative leadership and the national security policy framework.

This is a two week, full-time, fully catered, non-residential program.

### Who should attend?

Commonwealth EL1 officers; military officers levels 4/5; state and territory government equivalents as well as middle managers from the private sector, who are involved or moving into an area involved in national security policy, strategic planning, capability development or coordination. A **minimum SECRET (NV1)** security clearance is required.

### Why should you attend?

The program will develop your ability to identify and address, strategically and collaboratively, emerging challenges in Australian national security policy.

The program will enable you to:

- examine Australia's national security processes and arrangements;
- recognise how your work, and that of your department or agency, relates to the broader national security priorities;
- better understand how the national security community is addressing challenges and issues facing Australia; and
- establish collaborative networks and professional relationships across the national security community.
